Mid-Year Progress Reports

If you have a child in either Spark, Quest or Challenge Team, you will be receiving their mid-year progress report today which will be emailed by your child's homebase teacher. These reports will discuss your child's progress to date and will identify their next learning steps as we approach the second half of the year.

Please take the time to read through the information on these reports, discuss it with your child and praise them on their efforts and achievements. Teachers have put a large amount of work into writing these reports for you, so be sure to have a good read through and if you have any questions, please discuss these with your child's homebase teacher.

In case you were wondering, Year 1-3 reports are written and sent home on a different schedule to Yr 4-8 students. Reports are written after every 20, 40, 60, 80, 100 and 120 weeks of schooling for each individual child. Therefore our Junior teachers are writing reports on an ongoing basis depending on when each child started school.

Carpark and Broadlands Drive

You may be aware that in the coming few weeks/months (once Broadlands Drive has been extended to Rolleston-Springston Rd), the Selwyn District Council will be closing the entrance to Goulds Rd at the roundabout. This will mean that traffic will be likely to increase past our school.

Our BOT have been working with the SDC in regard to the roading around Clearview Primary and the BOT have had a professional road engineering firm assess our carpark and provide recommendations on how to improve this area to make it safer (more on that in the coming weeks).

Obviously, traffic volume on Broadlands Drive is heaviest around 9am and 3pm. There are vehicles, children and parents everywhere so **please slow down** and take extra care when driving in this vicinity. Thank you for your support and co-operation with this.

Clearview Zone Change

Recently we sent an email to all parents with information on the new zoning for Clearview Primary, due to the opening of Lemonwood Grove School in January 2017.

We wanted to clarify the 'Grandparenting Clause'. This simply means that the old rule will still apply to those who find themselves out of zone with the Lemonwood Grove new zone. In other words, if you are currently in our zone and find yourself in the new Lemonwood Grove zone, the child/ren can still attend Clearview as well as any future siblings (provided they are still living at the same address)

So to summarise:

- All students who live in the new Lemonwood Grove home zone and who were enrolled at Clearview Primary in or before 2016 will be able to continue their schooling at Clearview Primary School.
- Younger siblings will also be able to enrol at Clearview Primary School regardless of the amended enrolment home zone.
- This exemption applies only to the same family living at the same address as that recorded with the school at the end of the 2016 year.

Parking and Stopping Your Car

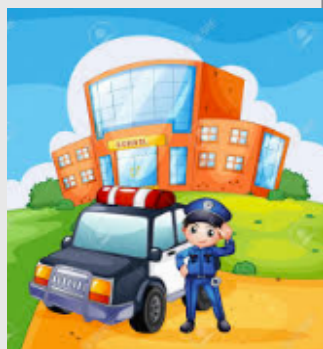
Broken yellow lines are placed in areas around the school where parking or stopping would cause an obstruction or danger to other road users. You can't park or stop your car on broken yellow lines - this means they are not "kiss and drop" zones.

The Road Code also lists other places where you can't park or stop, including near a corner, curve, traffic island or intersection, if it will stop other people from seeing along the road:
